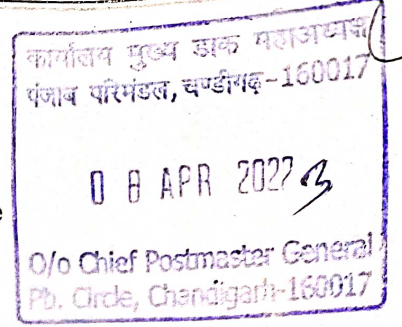

Further, it has been directed by Director (Vigilance), Department of Posts, Dak Bhawan, New Delhi vide letter No Vig-01/1/2021-Vigilance-DOP dated 31/03/2022 (Copy enclosed) that various instructions have been issued to the Circle Offices from time to time on the advice of the CVC regarding non-disclosure of the identity of the sender under PIDPI. However, staff in certain post offices are still not accepting letters marked as PIDPI without the sender's identity.

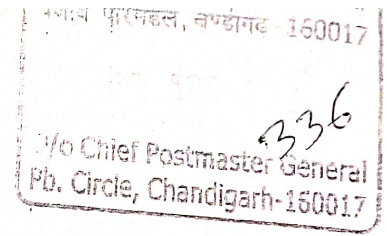

Sir/Madam,

This is regarding instructions issued in connection with non-disclosure of the identity of the sender under PIDPI. In this context, various instructions have been issued to the Circle offices from time to time on the advice of the CVC. However, staff in certain post offices are still not accepting letters marked as PIDPI without the sender's identity. The Commission has taken note of this issue in a recent meeting held at the Central Vigilance Commission.

It is therefore, requested to kindly furnish a compliance report regarding the actions taken for creating awareness among public as well as staff, including details of instructions issued to VOs alongwith pictures of posters designed for the purpose displayed at prominent places in different offices under your jurisdiction. It is further requested to inform whether the VOs of the Circles have taken VCs with the Divisional Heads to educate all concerned about the booking of articles under PIDPI.
